

Know all men by these Presents

That I Isaac S. Butler of the County of DeKalb, and State of Missouri being in poor health, but of sound and disposing mind, do make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills, by me at any time made.

1st It is my wish, to be decently buried, with no unnecessary expense.

2^d That my Executor (which I wish my wife to be) sell all my Personal Property, or so much as she may see fit, and first pay all my just debts, and if any money or other personal property remain, to become the sole and exclusive property of my wife, for the support of her and my Child.

My Real Estate situated in Section 19 & 20 of Township Sixty (60) of Range Thirty One (31) I give and bequeath to my wife to use as she may see fit for the benefit of herself and Child as long as she lives and should she outlive my Child, the property shall remain hers as long as she lives for her support.

My Real Estate situated in Section 13, Township 60 Range 32, I give to my wife exclusively to sell or dispose of as she may deem necessary for herself.
