First

It is my wish that all medical attendance and expenses funeral expenses and reasonable remuneration to those who care for me during my last sickness, also to erect suitable tombstones & shall be the first to be paid out of my estate

Second

It is my wish that there shall be reserved out of my estate the sum of Four hundred dollars one half of which shall be paid to Elizabeth Ewing (my grand child) at the age of eighteen and the other half to Ada May Ewing (another grand child at the age of Eighteen years This money to be kept at interest and my son John D Nassau and Adeline Jones to have the interest until the time specified to pay over to my said grand children if they desire to have the same

Third

To my beloved son John D Nassau I make this special bequest 1st my watch Bureau and Bed and Bedding,

Fourth

I also give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Adeline Jones a special bequest 1 1/2 the bed and bedding, bed springs Rocking chair and Sewing machines also all my wearing apparel

Fifth

All the balance of my household goods to be the sole and exclusive property of my son and daughter above named to be divided mutually between them,

Sixth

After all the above bequests shall have been paid out the rest, residue and remainder ^{of my estate} to be equally and mutually divided between my two children viz John D Nassau and Adeline Jones

Seventh

I hereby appoint and authorize Stephen D L Browning as my executor to this extent to cancel mortgages or give quitclaims or releases as for

as shall be necessary to make final discharges to
all matter touching my said estate Other bequests to
be paid by John D. ^{and wife} Hassaw and Adeline Jones

Eighth

I having fully confidence in the honesty and
uprightness of my children above named also in the
said Stephen D. Browning hereby them to do all
things herein named without giving bonds
